PAJAMA FACTORY TOURS (THROUGHOUT THE DAY)

11:00 AM, 2:00 PM and 3:00 PM

Construction of The Pajama Factory complex began in 1883 and continued through 1919. The building, originally built by Lycoming Rubber Company – a subsidiary of the U.S. Rubber Company, has been repurposed for many industries. In the 1930s, the Weldon Pajama Company began leasing a small portion of the building and, in 1951, purchased the building. By the mid-1950s, the complex is said to have housed the largest pajama factory in the world. Weldon Pajama Company closed in 1979, but the complex has continued to be utilized by entrepreneurs in the community. Current owners Mark and Susie Winkelman purchased the historic complex in 2008 with the vision of developing a creative community space. It is now home to a vibrant community of makers and creatives, with studio rooms, public establishments and more! Take a tour to learn about the history and visit some of the businesses and creative makers now calling this space home.
